

Provide a detailed explanation of the nominee's contribution

Domingo Magliocca is Italian police officer in Judicial Police Section of the local Prosecutor's Office. He has a master's degree in Applied Criminology for Investigation and Security at the University of Bologna; he is Geographic Profiling Advisor, first Italian operational analyst to be in possession of the license of Rigel, the professional geographic profiling system created by prof. Kim Rossmo, and to use it for research projects and for tactical-operational activities in geographic profiling analysis on specific crimes.

His main area of expertise is criminological and investigative sciences, geography of crime, serial offender's spatial pattern.

Domingo has always been committed to studying and researching criminal and geographic profiling, crime analysis, investigative techniques, serial crime

He believes that study, creativity, and curiosity are the highest and noblest forms of rebellion against cultural prejudice. Moving from this passion for criminology, crime analysis and by combining practice and theory:

- in thematic literature, Domingo is author of the only Italian books entirely dedicated to geographic profiling and tactical crime analysis, including (Italian titles) “Tracce geografiche criminali”, “Il geographic profiling. Dai luoghi del crimine al profilo geografico del serialista”, “Analisi della scena geografica del crimine. Indizi nel paesaggio”, “Il serialista Unabomber. Geographic Profiling a nord est”;
- in practice, he actively works in Italy with the best professional geographic profiling system, Rigel, the advanced tool created by Rossmo to locate the anchor point's area of serial offenders;
- in dedicated research, he created, in April 2025, the first *GOP (Geographic Offender Profiling) Research Unit*, the Specialized Research Unit of Istituto di Scienze Forensi (Italy) dedicated specifically for analyzing criminals' spatial patterns, a unit unparalleled in the Italian academic field;

His career and studies remain dedicated for integrating criminal investigation with geographic profiling to solve serial criminal cases.

Having said the above, proposing self-referential motivations for seeking an award, for me, Domingo, is no easy task, because I have the habit to study and work without prizes and with humility.

Therefore, in addition to the introductory section of my application, in which I explained who I am, my specialty and passion in investigative criminology, in crime analysis, in offender and geographic profiling, and the fact that I am the only analyst in Italy certified to use professional innovative geographic profiling decision support tool, I will avoid self-referential words, leaving the objective content of my CV to all of you, members of the IACA Bryan Hill Scholarship Award Board.

If necessary, I am available to send copies of publications and all certificates listed on the CV.

It would be an amazing idea if members outside the US borders could also receive the IACA Bryan Hill Scholarship Award, compared to past years. Bryan Hill was well known beyond the US borders and I still honorably preserve his email correspondence (*see the attached file*) and I remember his instructive insights.

Domingo Magliocca is an active member of the International Association of Crime Analysts (IACA), Co-Chair of the IACA European Division, International Development Sub-Committee - Membership

Committee, lecturer at Istituto di Scienze Forensi (ISF) in Corsico (MI, Italy), where he is also the head of GOP - Geographic Offender Profiling Research Unit.

Domingo Magliocca is the author of numerous scientific publications especially about geographic offender profiling, including the books (*see the attached file*), the only Italian publications with specific topic on geographic profiling analysis.

In 2022, he won, in Milan, the Investigation & Forensic Award, in the Criminological Sciences and Clinical Criminology category.

He is co-supervisor of thesis projects and also lecturer in Criminology Master degree, speaker in webinars, congresses and international conferences, including the national Congress of the Italian Society of Criminology, in Rome at the Carabinieri Officers' Academy (6-8 October 2022), where he had the oral presentation entitled "The geography of a cybercrime. The use of criminological principles and geographic profiling tools to investigate the spatial pattern and identify the probable area of the "anchor point" of a serial online offender".

In 2024, he was guest speaker at St. John's University in New York - Rome campus and at European Forensic Institute (EFI) of Malta.

Domingo collaborated, together with the investigators of Carabinieri's Criminological Analysis Department, in the creation of the book "The Criminal Profiling", published in 2024.

He contributed to the manual "*Perspectivas criminológicas en la inteligencia criminal estratégica*" (2025) for the Faculty Derecho e Criminología della Universidad Autónoma de Nuevo León (Mexico), coordinated by Professor Octavio Quintero Avila, and to the manual "*Crime Scene Investigation: Forensic Uncovered*", coordinated by Professor Amarnath Mishra (India), with his own chapter, respectively.

Magliocca was also a speaker for the "*Diplomado en Análisis Delictivo aplicado a la prevención e investigación del delito*", at University of Querétaro - Facultad de Derecho, in Mexico, and speaker for the "Diplomado En Anlisis Criminal", at University of Nuevo León - Facultad de Derecho y Criminología, Mexico.

Domingo Magliocca was recently interviewed by journalists of the "*Quotidiano Nazionale*", regarding the Italian Unabomber case and geographic profiling (*see the file attached*). His studies are also published in international magazines, such as Police Science Dr Magazine (*see the file attached*).

He organized, with his colleague Giovanni Pisapia (member of IACA), many webinars for the Italian crime analysis community, so much so that today in Italy there are 29 members, one of the European countries with the highest number of registered members.

As forefront of geographic profiling and spatial decision-making in serial crime, with his voice, ideas and his publications, Domingo Magliocca has contributed significantly to making the Italian operational method of geo-profiling known in criminology and crime analysis field.
