### Advanced Analytical Methods Using Microsoft Office (online) \*\*\*



Microsoft Office Suite has remained the go to set of tools for most police agencies. Most in the analyst community are familiar with the tools in some form or fashion. This 12-week course offers an advanced study of Access, Excel, PowerPoint, Word, and general statistics.

### Computer Applications for Crime Analysis (in person)



The Computer Applications course is a hands-on workshop in Microsoft Access, Excel, Word, and PowerPoint. Through a series of realistic lessons, analysts learn how to use the full potential of these programs for tactical, strategic, and administrative analysis.

### Crime Analysis for Small Jurisdictions (online) \*\*\*



This 12-week course is designed to introduce Crime Analysis to new and aspiring analysts and provide an understanding of its application within smaller jurisdictions (less than 125 officers) and with limited/time staffing.

### Criminal Investigative Analysis (online) \*\*\*



This 12-week online course helps students gain an understanding of criminal investigative analysis/criminal profiling. This course will examine factors that influence serious violent criminals and their behavior.

### Exploring Crime Analysis: Essential Skills I and II (online) \*\*\*



In two separate 12-week online courses designed to prepare for the CLEA exam, students will work through the IACA book entitled "Exploring Crime Analysis." Please note that I and II can be taken in any order and I is not a prerequisite for II.

### Problem Analysis (online)



Problem Analysis is a 12 - week online course where students will learn to examine long-term problems and how to recommend effective strategies to combat crime and disorder issues within their jurisdiction by applying criminology theory and research methods.

### Fundamentals of Crime Analysis (online) \*\*\*



The objective of this 12-week course is to expose students to a variety of analytical techniques utilized in law enforcement to describe and understand crime patterns, series, and trends as they occur.

### Optimizing Analytical Function in Policing (online) \*\*\*



This 12-week course is intended for managers and individuals of analytical units seeking to develop and improve the sustainability, professionalism, utilization, and legacy of their analytical capacities.

### Crime Mapping & Analysis (in person)



Crime Mapping is a hands-on computer-based course that covers the fundamentals of mapping crime for tactical, strategic, administrative, and operations analysis.

### Foundations of Crime Analysis (in person) \*\*\*



Foundations of Crime Analysis explores the basic terms, concepts, and techniques of crime analysis.

### Tactical Crime Analysis (in person)



Tactical Crime Analysis is a hand-on workshop that trains analysts in the techniques used to identify, analyze, and solve crime patterns and series.
