The IACA's **Analyst Mentoring Program** pairs new crime or intelligence analysts with more experienced peers in order to help them succeed in their new roles.

Mentor Eligibility Requirements

Prospective mentors must have been a current IACA member for at least a year as verified by the IACA membership database.

Selection of mentors will be made by the Mentoring Committee or its designees.

Preference will be given to those applicants who meet one or more of the following criteria:

- IACA Certified Law Enforcement Analyst (CLEA)
- IACA Executive Board member or member of another recognized professional analyst association's board.
- Satisfactory IACA committee experience
- University-level instructor
- IACA Training Series instructor
- IACA Conference or Symposium presenter
- IACA members who have demonstrated their knowledge, skills and abilities in various training and who can furnish a written recommendation from another member who possesses one of the above-listed criteria.

A mentor may request to be assigned to multiple mentees at the same time if approved by the Mentoring Committee.



Mentee Eligibility Requirements

This program is open to individuals who meet the following requirements:

- Must be a current IACA member
- Must be currently employed as a crime or intelligence analyst at a law enforcement agency* (local, state, Federal or international)

*At this time, the program is not open to students; mentees must be working analysts.

Each mentor/mentee pairing will run for 6 months to one year. After 6 months, both members will be asked to complete an evaluation to provide feedback on their experience in the program.

The IACA reserves the right to approve, deny or revoke mentee or mentor participation at the discretion of the Mentoring Committee or the Executive Board.

The IACA plans to continue expanding the Analyst Mentoring Program to help even more new analysts reach their greatest potential.
